

Air Raid Shelters



As a local resident for over thirty six years, I was always curious about the rumours of a lost air raid shelter on The Green. This Spring we started a project to try and find them, and any first hand eye witnesses. We have now established the whereabouts of two shelters. One is located at the corner of First Cross Road and the Staines Road. It stretches back as far as the Jack And Jill School. When first built in 1939, it had the capacity to shelter over six hundred people.

We have had fascinating exchanges with people who had used the shelter. One lady who now lives in Nashville, Tennessee, remembers playing down the shelter, the awful smell of the chemical toilets, and that is was so large you could get lost down there.

We have also established that there was a second shelter, near where Arthurs Restaurant now stands. Both shelters can be seen in outline, and with their descending staircase entrances on a 1946 aerial photo of The Green. Interestingly, this also shows how half the Green was turned over to allotments.

The project is ongoing. We still hope to find when they were closed down; were they filled in, and any initial building plans. We will keep you posted.
