Green update by Howard Roberts, Environment Officer A little rain and a little sunshine, and The Green transforms itself, each spring, every year. Not that it has been an easy winter. Events held on The Green in December caused extensive surface damage and have left the surface in a poor state in some parts of the events end (Arthurs end) of The Green. On the positive side, Parks have undertaken re-turfing in four key damaged areas, currently with a good degree of success. As ever, much will depend on weather and climate, and of course the volume of traffic across the grass.

Our five saplings have all survived the winter and are already in bud. Our volunteer tree waterers will be ready to go in to action if and when the first dry spells start to take effect. We now have our full complement of trees, and the mix of Chestnuts, Lime trees and London Planes are all thriving.

The shrubbery behind Arthurs is long overdue for attention and a makeover, and Parks are preparing a planting scheme for later in the year. Our other shrubbery behind the pavilion, was re-planted with roses in the autumn, and I am very pleased to say these are now all in leaf and looking good.
